AHP Displays Newest Artifact

The NASA T-38 took its place last October making it the 5th aviation artifact on display at Aviation Heritage Park. The T-38 Talon was flown by 82 of 85 astronauts in the United States Astronaut Hall of Fame, including Neil Armstrong, Alan Shepard and John Glenn. AHP joins the elite prestige of being one of 13 parks to have a T-38 on display. AHP added this particular artifact to its park to pay honor to a local hero, Col. Terrance "Terry" Wilcutt. Col. Wilcutt a native of Russellville KY and a graduate of Western Kentucky University had an exemplary military career and went on to become an astronaut with NASA. Wilcutt, a veteran of four space flights served as commander for two of them. Currently Col. Wilcutt serves as the Deputy Director of Safety and Mission Assurance at Johnson Space Center in Houston.

Paper Plane Contest Takes Flight

Two high flying Warren County Students claim top honors in the first annual Aviation Heritage Park Paper Airplane Contest. Prince Patel, a fifth grader from Jody Richards Elementary, won the 4th-6th Grade division launching his plane 23 feet. Tanner Cosby a South Warren Middle School 8th grader, took the trophy for 7th-8th Grade division with a flight distance of 81 feet. Besides trophies both pilots received scholarships to Aviation Summer Camp at the Bowling Green/Warren County Regional Airport next June.

Aviation Heritage Park successfully hosted its inaugural paper airplane contest on November 22, 2014 at the Bowling Green Junior High School.

Competition was open to all local elementary and junior high schools. The rules were simple, planes had to be made from a single piece of typing paper. Each school was asked to hold a paper airplane contest and send its winner to represent his/her school at the regional event. More than 450 students participated at the school level.

"Our goal for this event is for students to use their own initiative with the support of their parents and teachers to learn and have a fun and exciting experience beyond their classroom," Board Member Eric Gregory said. "By working together with the local teachers we were able to bring about opportunities for students to succeed in areas of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) education."

Next year AHP plans to include schools from surrounding counties.

Local Hero Inducted Into KY Aviation Hall of Fame

One of Aviation Heritage Park's own was inducted in November into the Kentucky Aviation Museums Hall of Fame.

Col. Arnold Franklin USAF (Ret), a Distinguished Flying Cross recipient, was recognized for his award winning combat in Vietnam and for his successful strike mission from England to Libya in 1986 where he led 18 General Dynamics F-111s from Royal Air Force Station, Lakenheath, England, on a mission bombing three targets in Libya. The mission lasted more than 14 hours. The bombing run over Libya lasted a long 2 minutes.



Col. Franklin, a local hero, was born in Franklin, KY and graduated from high school in Bowling Green, KY. He then went on to study at Western Kentucky University where he earned a degree in Engineering Physics in 1966. He later went on to graduate from the Air Force Institute of Technology with a Master's degree in laser physics in 1975. Additionally, he graduated from Air Command and Staff College in 1980 and National War College in 1988.

"There are more people than I can possibly remember to thank tonight," Franklin said during his acceptance speech.

"This is truly an honor and I am humbled by receiving it."

Franklin received this honor surrounded by many family members and friends. Before Franklin was introduced, Gen Cherry asked that all representative from Bowling Green to please stand and almost half the room stood to welcome Franklin onto the stage.

The Talon honors Col. Terry Wilcutt and the late David Finney of Auburn. Finney retired from NASA in 2008 where he served as the chief of the Johnson Space Center Aircraft Operations Division in the Flight Crew Operations Directorate.

Gen. Bolden was honored with the opportunity to dedicate the T-38 Talon in honor of Col. Terry Wilcutt. He spoke about the importance of engaging youth of our community about flying and the space program.

He also talked about the importance of the history of each of the pilots that flew each plane located at Aviation Heritage Park.

During the ceremony, Col. Wilcutt spoke about the accomplishments of Finney as he served our country and NASA. Finney served as a pilot during the Vietnam War. After retiring from the Navy he joined NASA as a civilian research pilot. During his speech, Wilcutt reminisced about flying under the watchful eye of Finney, "He would inform you if you made a slip," Wilcutt said. "His technical expertise, moral courage, personal integrity, and leadership set a standard for all of us."

Finney's wife Jill along with Gen. Bolden unveiled David Finney's name, which was appropriately placed on the rear cockpit, the instructor's seat. Following the unveiling, Finney's brother, Rear Admiral (Ret) James Finney spoke about the pride he and his family felt for David's accomplishments.
